CHILD CARE



Over 17,000 kids nurtured

As the largest child care provider in Kansas, the Y provides youth with the tools and resources they need to succeed in life. 6,681 kids and teens explored new interests, learned new skills and built relationships at 28 summer day and overnight camps. 3,698 children prepared for kindergarten in 21 early learning programs. 6,779 youth discovered support and friendship in 102 before and after school programs.

THRIVING YOUTH



1 in 4 Kansas kids served

The Y is committed to empowering children to lead healthy, active lifestyles. From gaining confidence to building positive relationships with adults and kids alike, youth at the Y develop lifelong, healthy habits from the inside out. 10,949 youth learned life-saving swim skills, and 27,279 kids learned teamwork and stayed active in our youth sports programs. 144,922 kids were impacted by a Y program or service in 2022.

445,481 Kansans served by 10 YMCA associations

The Y provides a supportive environment for families of all backgrounds, ages, and abilities where people can meet their health and wellbeing goals through exercise, nutrition, and chronic disease prevention programs.

VOLUNTEERISM



6,772 volunteers donated 195,527 hours

The Y is the charity of choice for thousands of Kansans who donated \$20.2 million in 2022. These volunteers gave \$5.3 million worth of their time, talent and effort to better Kansas communities.

BUILDING CAREERS



3,486 Kansans employed

The Y employs neighbors to help neighbors. Kansas YMCAs employ thousands of full-time, part-time and seasonal staff—many of them youth. This large and diverse workforce is an economic engine in our state.

49.342 Kansas seniors connected

Kansas Y programs help prevent social isolation in older Kansas adults by allowing them to connect and engage in meaningful activities. Small lifestyle changes such as increasing physical activity, eating healthier and staying active socially can help older adults live better.

MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS




\$9,871,804 given in financial assistance
